Kerala, India - The G20 Global Innovation Hub for Improving Value in Health (the Hub) participated in the first G20 Health Working Group meeting hosted in Kerala, India, on 18-20 January 2023. The meeting was attended by representatives from the G20 countries, international organizations, and other invited guests.

The priorities of the Indian Presidency include:

- 1. Priority I: Health Emergencies Prevention, Preparedness and Response (with focus on One Health & AMR)
- 2. Priority II: Strengthening Cooperation in Pharmaceutical Sector with focus on Access and Availability to safe, effective, quality and Affordable Medical Countermeasures (Vaccines, Therapeutics and Diagnostics)
- 3. Priority III: Digital Health Innovations and Solutions to Aid Universal Health Coverage and Improve Healthcare Service Delivery

The Hub highlighted the importance of value-based care to support health system transformation.

"The Global Innovation Hub aims to accelerate the transformation of health systems to achieve and sustain UHC through delivering high value. This is achieved by focusing on people and on health & care outcomes that matter most to them. Compared to the legacy of reactive episodic care, where health service delivery occurs after illness, high value health systems offer a proactive, more holistic & equitable approach," said Dr. Reem Bunyan, Executive Director of the Hub.
